Marionettes have existed for thousands of years. Ancient examples have been found in Egypt and India made out of terracotta, ivory or bone and were used in religious ceremonies. Most marionettes mentioned in the Middle Ages were made out of wood and had "invisible" strings or wires. They were manipulated from above by a handle, called a controller, by stings or a combination of strings and metal rods. (Currell)

Where were puppets?

Puppets were known to act out Bible stories as well as any popular play or satire or their day. They were used for teaching inside the **church** until they became too bawdy and were kicked out. They would often borrow from the live theater any script no longer in use. The live theater had to work diligently to keep the puppeteers from stealing their material, which was protected by guilds. Puppets were popular and they played to their audiences, whether at a **fair**, in a **theater** or at a **private estate** of a wealthy landowner. (Joseph)
